Robin Class (YR)

We have been exploring the story of The Little Red Hen. The children have been using a story map to retell the story with actions.



We have been reflecting upon our experiences of visiting farms and learning how wheat growing in a farmer's field turns into flour for making bread. The children have been grinding corn using stones and have used flour to make their own tasty bread rolls.

As mathematicians we have been looking at how we can make different types of shapes such as a tall rectangle and a wide rectangle, through placing 2D shapes together. We have also started learning a doubling fact each week, this week we are reciting '1 and 1 is 2. Double 1 is 2'. Next week we will move on to double 2.

Collective Worship

The theme for this term is, 'Truthfulness'. We have already had lots of interesting discussions about this! The children have enjoyed thinking about the Moral in a few of 'Aesop's Fables' so this is something you could continue at home.

Our enquiry for this term is 'What is a story?' We have been creating stories using small world characters and sharing helicopter stories (children create and act out their own stories).


Starling Class (Y1)

Kingfisher Class (Y4 / Y5)

As we begin our last term of the year, we have a lot still to look forward to. We have begun our new enquiry 'How are you helping to save the planet?' by learning about the seven natural wonders of the Earth and how plastic pollution and deforestation are having a negative impact. Our challenge this term is to help make the school garden a more wildlife-friendly environment, I have been talking with Anne (our school caretaker) about lots of exciting possibilities!



In our Author lessons we have been working with a text called 'The Promise', unpacking the story by theatrical reading and role play to help inform our own creative writing. We have also used this text to inspire an amazing free verse poem and some fabulous pieces of art.

With regard to maths, please be aware particularly if you are a parent of a year 4 student, that they will soon be sitting the DfE Multiplication Check. Please be practising with your children (Yr5s would benefit from regular practise too). Unfortunately, the

children cannot practise on the testing website at home, as the passwords change daily.

We have also begun to rehearse songs for the upcoming Yr6 production of Hamlet. We have been asked to support in the capacity of ensemble / choir – this will mean a couple of evening performances in July (12th / 13th) Please put these dates in your diaries and look out for ticket!



Owl Class (Y6)

A time of new projects for us Owls! Rehearsals for Hamlet are starting in earnest, we're learning lines at a rate of knots, although any support you can offer with practising your child's lines at home is welcome.



We have also started a new enquiry "How Big Is Your Footprint?" We have discussed energy sources, the uses of energy and how wealth and poverty impact access to energy in different parts of the world -a very important conversation. In English, the children have written pieces of descriptive writing for their Author Portfolios, making our blood run cold with their descriptions of the parapets of Elsinore Castle in Act 1, Scene 1 of Hamlet.
