Dear parent(s) / carer(s),

Welcome back to term 3 where the temperature has dropped somewhat. Although the sun is out most days the temperature through the day is still very cold, so please ensure your children come to school wearing their school jumpers and coats at an absolute minimum. We do make sure that all children have some outside time, so this is really important.

Snacks and lunch boxes

We are still noticing that some children are bringing in snacks that are not appropriate or healthy. Please ensure that your children come to school with a healthy snack - fruit for example. We have seen children brining in big bags of crisps, chocolate and sweets, which is not part of the school policy. This also applies to snacks being brought in for after school club - this will need to be monitored by staff and we will speak to parents should this continue. Please also remember that we are a NUT FREE school. We have a few allergies this year and we need to minimize these children becoming poorly. Any kind of nut products such as cereal bars and chocolate spread will contain nuts. Please speak to the office or your class teacher if you are unsure about what you can bring to school

Reading

We have relaunched our reading scheme, Read, Write Inc where your children - especially in key stage 1 - will be learning sounds and learning to read. They will be coming home with books that they can read at their own level. It is so important that your children come to school EVERY DAY with their book bags and return their books every day! Please help us to ensure this happens - EVERY CHILD has been issued with a book bag from when they started at Willow Park, along with books and their reading records. Please also listen to your child read at least 3 times a week - this will really help your child and help us in school too.

In maths we are looking at multiplication so any extra times table practice at home would be amazing. For writing this term we are looking at a text called 'Nail Soup' and we are going to write our own story based on 'Nail Soup'.



Our enquiry topic question this term is` How can we switch off?` we are looking at gelectricity and using the circuit equipment in school to make light bulbs work.

I will send weekly homework home on a Friday, and this is to be bought back into school on the following Friday. Also, please can you listen to your child read at least three times a week at home. This will have such a positive impact on their learning.

PE days are Wednesday and Friday this term with Friday PE being swimming. Please ensure your child has the appropriate clothing for both PE sessions.





Kingfisher Class (Y5)

Kingfisher students have been learning how to use narrative writing to describe the most important events in their lives from 2022.

They have had fun last week sharing their experiences and it has been a great way to start a fresh new year.



Owl Class (Y6)

It has been a fast-paced week in Year 6, as we have packed in learning across the curriculum; from exploring the music of British composer Benjamin Britten
