We have had a busy fortnight in Owl Class, completing our termly assessment cycle and working on identifying which next steps we need to focus our attention on.

We are welcoming additional adults who will supporting the children in a number of ways; Mr Matthews, who will be offering weekly tutoring to close attainment gaps, several reading buddies from the BBC, mathematician Mr Bloomer who thrills us with his passion for numbers twice a week, and Miss Hayes who has joined us as an additional adult in class.

In English, we have worked on analysing and writing poetry, and are now focussing on recipes and instructional writing. In PE, we are coming to the end of what has been an incredible unit of work on interpretive dance, based on our work in English. The children have created stunning dances, focussing on sequences of repetitive movements and rhythm. The final pieces have been touching, beautiful and clearly indicative of how moving we have found this term's class novel Drowned City by Don Brown.

Golden Eagles (Y3 / Y4 / Y5 / Y6)

Golden Eagles went to the Mshed. We saw lots of interesting things from Bristol in the past, like this old bus.
