 Creating a love of reading in children is potentially one of the most powerful ways of improving academic standards in school.

•There can be few better ways to improve pupils chances in school, or beyond in the wider world than to enable them to become truly independent readers.

Reading Books at Present

Once children can blend sounds together, a reading book is sent home weekly with a reading record.

The reading books match the sounds each child knows, which is assessed termly using Read Write Inc reading assessments. Children who are reading at a level higher than RWI are assessed through benchmarking. We assess reading fluency, accuracy, intonation and comprehension.

By the end of Term 1 2023


Children will be coming home with different types of books. There will be:

Reading for pleasure is about encouraging the love and enjoyment of reading, through children listening to stories that they cannot yet read for themselves.




These books also support the development of children's vocabulary, conversation skills and their comprehension.

Reading Record Book

Every time you listen to your child read please share this with us by writing in the book:

- The title of the book.
- The page numbers your child read.
- A comment about how well your child has read.
- Who listened to your child read.

Class teachers will be checking reading record books weekly and rewarding children who have read three or more times each

Please make sure all of the school books and your child's reading record book are brought into school daily.

Supporting your child to read is the most important thing you can do to help your child succeed!
