We teach sounds, children practice reading and spelling words containing these sounds, then we give decodable books containing sounds and words they can read.




What is phonics?




Phonics is the method of teaching reading through the identification of sounds and graphemes (written form).

We use 44 sounds to make all of the words in the English language.





We have 44 sounds but only 26 letters.






Single sounds

In pairs (digraph)

In groups of 3 (trigraph)

The 26 letters work singularly, in pairs and sometimes in groups of threes to represent one sound. Every day we learn a new sound in Robin Class.




Speed Sounds Set 1 and Set 2



Order of the sounds


We teach the sounds in this order. The first set of five sounds are m a s d t.






Name the pictures

To help the children remember the sounds we teach them the mnemonic pictures before they learn the sound.





sounds + blending = reading



Alongside teaching children sounds, we teach them to blend sounds to read words, for example s-a-t, sat.



Fred



This is Fred, he can only speak in sounds such as d-o-g and h-a-t.

Fred helps children practice blending sounds together because he needs the children to say the words for him. Fred says d-o-g, children tell him the word dog.

What would you like to p-l-ay?




We use Fred Talk throughout the day in Robin Class to practice blending sounds together.





Reading at home






Your child is already coming home with a Reading for Pleasure book.



Once your child can blend sounds they will also come home with a RWI Sound Blending book and a Reading Record book.






Date	Book Title	Comment

After listening to your child read their RWI Sound Blending book please write in their Reading Record book. We are encouraging families to listen to their children read at least three times a week.



The RWI books progress in difficulty as they progress through the coloured book levels.









The RWI books children come home with are decodable. This means all of the sounds required to read the words within their book are sounds your child has been taught.

'Fred talk, read the word'

If your child hesitates whilst trying to read a word, please remind your child to 'Fred talk' then 'read the word'.

Some words are 'tricky' because they contain letters that do not match the sounds the children have been taught.

"I will grab that cash box," he said.

We teach these common exception words as Red Words.

What can I do?

- 1. Use pure sounds, not letter names

- 3. Listen to your child read their reading books at least three times a week and write in their Reading Record book.
- 4. Read stories to your child every day and discuss the story together.
- 5. Speak to us, we are here to support your child's reading journey
