

Housekeeping

Please ensure your child comes to school every day with their green book bag, a coat and a freshly filled water bottle. It is very important to ensure that everything your child brings into school is clearly named. As well as this, please check your child's book bag daily for letters, phonic sheets and art work. Reading books will also be kept in their book bags once your child is able to blend sounds, more information about this will be shared at the phonics workshop.

Baseline Assessments

All Reception children will be undertaking a selection of play-based tasks as part of the statutory government baseline assessment throughout the first six weeks of starting school. The purpose of the assessment is to provide a starting point that will help parents understand how well schools support their pupils progress between Reception and Year 6. Otherwise, we will have to phone you before your child can be released. We are responsible for safeguarding your child and we know you will understand the importance with regard to this matter.

Date for your diary

You are invited to Robin Class's Phonics Meeting on Thursday 5th October 9 -10:30am in the school hall. Learning to read is vitally important for learning, communication, stimulating the imagination and expanding your child's knowledge and experience.

During the meeting we will share with you:

- Why and how we teach phonics
- When your child will start to receive reading books
- How we would like you to help your child by looking at books and listening to them read at home (this has been updated for September 2023 and is new to ALL parents in Willow Park)

Please come along, as it is vital to understand phonics and how it supports early reading and writing, two skills that we teach your child in Reception. A great deal of time, care and patience are given to teaching your child to read and we see this as a partnership with you. At school we teach phonics and at home you reinforce and practice what has been learned. Your contribution is essential to enable your child to progress and develop a love of reading.
